		<p>Hybrid Teas: Large flowers normally set one per stem, medium to tall habit, and long cutting stems.</p> <p>Grandifloras: Large flowers in clusters, usually taller in habit with individual stems of clusters suitable for cutting.</p>
		<p>Cinnamon Dolce (HT) Cinnamon Dolce has a unique novel color, great exhibition form and very strong fragrance. The disease resistance is very good for the west coast.</p>

	<p>Sunbeam Veranda Bright yellow flowers combined with shiny dark-green foliage make this a beautiful rose to feature in a patio container. Also well suited for planting in a compact garden.</p>
	<p>Sunset Horizon Just like the colors of the sky can change as the sun dips below the horizon, so this rose will change color as it makes its home in your garden. the large blooms begin bright yellow suffused with red tones, especially toward the petal edges. As they open, the red color intensifies until it covers nearly the entire bloom. Vigorous plants almost continuously blanket themselves with the colorful blooms, and their semi-glossy foliage resists black spot with ease.</p>
	<p>Sexy Remy Full clear pink blooms are sometimes borne in huge clusters that virtually cover the plant. Tall for a floribunda and nearly disease free and can be used as a hedge or shrub where spraying is impractical. If you can find it beneath all that bloom, the foliage is shiny dark green.</p>
	<p>White Lies The fully double, clustered blooms of <i>White Lies</i> open bright white, which, if you didn't know better, might make you think you have the wrong rose. but as the name implies, the rounded flowers quickly flush to an intense red before finishing completely maroon. considering the bushy, rounded plants with their glossy green leaves are blooming machines, you'll have plenty to watch on this colorful creation.</p>

	<p>Darcey Bussell</p> <p>When young, the outer petals of each bloom form a perfect ring around an inner cup, gradually opening out to form a perfect, medium-large rosette. The color is a deep, rich crimson-pink, taking on a tinge of mauve just before the petals drop. There is a light-medium fruity scent. It forms a compact shrub with attractive bushy growth.</p>
	<p>Graham Thomas (climber)</p> <p>With its vigorous, upright growth, it makes a very good climber, both in beauty and performance. It bears medium-sized, cupped blooms of an unusually rich, pure shade of yellow. They have a light Tea fragrance.</p>
	<p>Lichfield Angel</p> <p>Pale peachy pink buds gradually open to form neatly cupped, cream rosettes. Each bloom has a perfect ring of waxy petals enclosing numerous smaller petals. Eventually the petals turn back to form a large, domed flower. It forms a vigorous, rounded, almost thornless shrub, its blooms nodding attractively on the branch.</p>
	<p>The Mill On The Floss</p> <p>Bears large clusters of small, neat, deeply cupped blooms, each eventually revealing a small boss of stamens. Initially mid pink, verging on lilac-pink, they pale as they open, the individual petals beautifully defined by their carmine edges. Held nicely above the foliage, they nod gracefully on gently arching growth, and have a sweet fruity fragrance. A healthy variety; it makes a bushy shrub, clothed in glossy foliage.</p>

	<p>Climers</p>
	<p>Cloud 10 Cloud 10 is a vigorous hybrid climber that blooms heavily in the spring and continually blooms throughout the season. Its pure white, very full blooms (50-60 petals) are stunning, similar to English roses and are accompanied by exceptionally clean foliage. The cupped blooms are 2.25” in diameter on average and are borne mostly solitary in small clusters. On top of that, they are a gift to gardeners who struggle with diseases in their garden as they are fully resistant to blackspot and almost immune to rust and mildew.</p>
	<p>Hot ‘N’ Spicy This saucy little number grows vigorously and blooms in fiery fluorescent orange-red flushes throughout the season, adding some zest to your life, and maybe even raising your temperature a couple of degrees.</p>
	<p>Raspberry Cream Twirl This rose is the first striped climber with classic, exhibition-type blooms. The large, very full, cuplike blooms offer a deep pink with white stripes and emit a light apple fragrance. This robust plant grows to be 10-12’ tall and 4-5’ wide and has medium, glossy, dark green foliage that is dense and leathery. Its excellent resistance to diseases makes this a wonderful climber that can perform well all over the country. On top of it all, it is almost thornless, making it the perfect rose for cutting, gardens, pillars or high foot-traffic areas.</p>
	<p>Tangerine Skies This high and mighty climber will be a beacon of light in any garden! Reaching heights up to 8 feet tall, Tangerine Skies™ Arborose® is an outstanding choice for tall arbors or trellises. The blooms it produces are a peachy mango blend and sit beautifully against glossy, dark green foliage. In addition, this Kordes® rose is incredibly resistant against common diseases.</p>
